A Message from Pastor Dan:

"Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved." (Acts 2:46–47)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As brothers and sisters in Christ, we will spend eternity together after, in many cases, we spend our lives together. The reality that we who gather to worship our God in Winsted have a bond and connection that will carry into eternity challenges the mind, but it is one day what we will experience. On this earth, we must love God and others and make disciples of Jesus. The early apostolic church is described in Acts 2:42-47. It is marked by devotion to the Scriptures, fellowship, worship, the Lord's supper, prayer, self-sacrifice for others, sharing meals together, and growing as disciples of Christ.

The first-century Apostolic Church is the true church, and we must emulate it. To that end, I would like us to launch three groups in 2025 that will enhance our fellowship and help us grow as Jesus' disciples. I am seeking your help to establish a men's and a women's fellowship, which will help us grow beyond our friend groups. I would like to see each of these groups meet 4 to 6 times per year for a variety of events (fellowship, discipleship, and outreach), including one event for the whole church. I am looking for men and women who will step up to lead these two vital ministries and help us grow as the body of Christ in Winsted. In addition, I will lead the prayer group, which will meet each Wednesday at 5:30 pm in the music room, followed by Bible Study at 6:00 pm. If you cannot attend the prayer group in person, you can join on Zoom. Just let me know, and I will send you the link.

In 1 Corinthians 1:10, Paul writes, "Now I exhort you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment." In my estimation, the successful long-term establishment of the groups described above will help us all develop Christian character and become the Bible-focused and Christ-centered church, united in Christ, that God would have us be.

As the month of February approached, there were a few concerns that there would not be enough supplies for certain family necessities. We serviced fourteen families (one was new to us) and fifteen clients, which was down a bit from January, but we were fighting that cold, freezing rain and a fire alarm just before we opened the building, which might have scared a few away.

I received an email from our new friends at the *CT Diaper Bank* in North Haven to inform us there was a "blessing" waiting for us to pick up. A blessing in the form of 9,637 total items (diapers, pull-ups, wipes) with a value of \$1,136.45 that has given us the peace of mind that we are all set for a few months with our inventory to service all our families.

Below is a picture to give you a better idea of what that blessing looked like. Along with that, I want to recognize the volunteers that came to the rescue that day; John and Carol Young to drive to North Have and pick up the items, to the unloading and stocking crew of Andi Craig, Dave Markey, Amber Craig, Hector Cruz-Craig and I would be remiss if I didn't recognize our monthly volunteers that show up without even being called; Eileen Davis, Denise and Anaya Killiany, Amy Robinson, Nancy and

Kristin Schneller. These individuals take on this time at the diaper bank like a true mission of their heart. We could not remain open to serving the community if it were not for people like them. When you see them again, please take a moment and thank them for representing the Second Congregational Church of Winsted with love in their hearts. There's always room for more volunteers, so if you feel compelled to help, just let us know.



We will continue to accept donations for future needs and watch for more news from the Missions Ministry about a special event you can be a part of in April.

Unfortunately, we did not get a picture this time of the Young's "loaded truck" because their first granddaughter was born earlier that morning so, they dropped the boxes and ran! Once again, talk about commitment to the Diaper Bank! Thanks Grandpa and Grandma!!!

STATEMENT OF FAITH

- 1. We believe there is only one living and true God, Creator of all things, infinite in wisdom, goodness, and love, eternally existing in three persons, The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit. (Ex. 20:1–6; Deut. 6:4; Ps. 96:4–5; Mt. 28:19; Jn. 1:1; 2 Cor. 13:14)
- 2. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the inspired Word of God and that they are the supreme authority in faith and life and absolutely trustworthy.

 (Ps. 119: Mk. 13:31; Jn. 10:35, 17:17; 2 Pet. 1:21; 2 Tim. 3:16–17; 1Thess. 2:13)
- 3. We believe that God, in His goodness, created only two distinct and complementary genders, male and female, which is defined by one's biological sex at birth. These two genders together reflect the image and nature of God, and rejection of one's biological sex is a rejection of God's created order and the image of God within that person.

(Gen. 1:26–28,31; 2:2-24; Lev 18:22-23; 20;10-21; Deut 22:5; Is3:12; Rom 1:24-27; 1Cor 6-9; 11:7; 1Tim 2:11-15)

4. We believe that man and woman sinned and thereby incurred not only physical death but also spiritual death, which is separation from God, and that we are all born with a sinful nature that mars God's image in us.

(Gen 1:26-27; 2:7; 3:1-24; Ezek 13:23; Rom 5:12; Eph 2:1-3; James 3:9)

5. We believe that Jesus Christ is the only begotten Son of God conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, and is truly God and Man.

(Is 7:14; Matt 1:18,23; Luke 1:30-35; 2:6-7,40; John 1:14; Phil 2:6-7; Heb 1:2-5; 2:14)

6. We believe that, out of love for us, the Lord Jesus Christ died to atone for our sins according to the Scriptures and that all who repent of sin and place their faith in Him alone are reconciled to God by His shed blood.

(Is 53:4-6; Mark 1:14-15; John 14:6; Rom 5:8; 8:3; 1John 4:10; 1Pet 2:24-25)

7. We believe that Christ rose from the dead and ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father to reign over all things.

(Luke 24:1-7; John 2:19-21; Acts 1:9; Heb 4:14,10:11-13; Rev 1:17-18)

- 8. We believe that all who repent of sin and receive the Lord Jesus Christ, which is by grace alone through faith alone, are born of the Holy Spirit and thereby become the children of God and shall not come into condemnation and that the Lord Jesus Christ gives them everlasting life.

 (John 1:12-13; 3:16-18,36; 5:24-29; 10:27-29; Acts 4:12; Rom 8:1,9-12,15-17; 10:9-11; Gal 4:24-29; Eph 1:5; 1 John 5:12-13)
- 9. We believe that Christ has called all Christians into universal fellowship in His church. This church is made up of local congregations where members worship through Word and sacrament, are trained in discipleship and are called to evangelize the world in charity.

(Matt 16:18-19; 18:17; John 17; Acts 2:42; 6:1-6; 20:28-32; 1Cor 10:1-14:40; Eph 5:21-32; 1Thes 5:12-13; 1Tim 3:1-16; 5:17-22; Heb 10:25; 1Pet 5:1-4)

10. We believe that God created marriage to be a holy and lifelong covenant union, which can only be between one man and one woman who are not closely related, and that the only lawful place for intimate relations is marriage.

(Gen 2:22-24; Ex 22:16-17; Deut 22:14; Mal 2:16; Matt 19:4-6; Eph 5:5,21-6:4; Col 3:18-21; 1Tim 1:8-10; Heb 13:4)

11. We believe that at The Last Day, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will return according to His promise and that He will judge the world, and the saved will receive the blessing of life in His eternal kingdom and that the lost will be eternally separated from God.

(Matt 25:31-46; Rom 8:35-39; 1Thes 4:13-17; Rev 20:12-15, 21-27)
